- Each HS code to six digits must be paced in part 9.

Each item invoiced that has a different 6-digit tariff code must be shown on this document.

Example: 7308.10, 7308.90

Parts of an item which are classified to a separate HS code must be shown separately.

For example, 1. HS code 8528.51 monitors. Parts for this 8529.90

Example 2: Items of 8421.10 parts 8421.90.

There must not be more than 20 HS codes per certificate

Rules of Origin must be shown on the certificate part 10.

- Goods wholly obtained or produced goods = WO
- Goods produced entirely from originating materials = WP
- Goods produced from non-originating materials, but meet the product specific rules =PSR
 - An exporter or producer may choose to complete a Declaration of Origin (DOO). A DOO may be accepted in place of a COO for goods covered by an advance ruling on origin.

Australian goods being imported from China must have a certificate of origin issued in China by the following organization's:

- General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine (AQSIQ) .
- The China Council for the Promotion of International Trade
